





Children's Corner

Dear Children,

As you read this Children's Corner, the beautiful blue skies of October and the sparkling chilly weather of November are behind us - Columbus Day, Halloween, Veteran's Day, and Thanksgiving are now memories. Another piece of the Church Year is now here - Advent - meaning "the coming" of the Christ Child. Advent starts the last Sunday of November (November 30) and continues for three more Sundays. This is a very busy time for everyone as people are baking cookies, buying gifts, and decorating the house - our lives become very chaotic. I think a rest from this busy time is in order; and, although these fun preparations are necessary, let's carve some space in our schedules for a more thoughtful way of waiting for Jesus. We are blessed with four weeks to turn our busy lives into something meaningful. Think about the meaning of Advent, listen to the words of the Advent hymns (Come Thou Long Expected Jesus; Comfort, Comfort Ye My People; O Come, O Come Emmanuel) and look at the banner colors. Blue means hope - we wait in hope for the coming of the Savior (purple is sometimes used too.) As you journey through these next few weeks, here are some ideas you

might try to bring your heart back to the long-expected Jesus:

1. Make a simple Advent wreath lighting the candles (with an adult) as you say a thankful prayer.
2. Use an Advent calendar - each day write a prayer or a Bible verse.
3. Select a peaceful time and keep a journal (a thankful journal, a memory journal.)
4. Make dinner place mats showing how you can help others.
5. Design a chrismon (a round ornament that is embroidered - usually hung on a tree.)
6. Bake cookies with a friend to give to someone who needs to be cheered.
7. Make Christmas cards to send to the military.

Many of these ideas can be found in our children's library - check out the new location. While you are looking for any directions for the above items, the library has many wonderful stories about Advent and Christmas. Getting ready for Christmas can be very hectic, but time spent in reflection about "the grandest gift of all" will slow us down to a more contemplative pace.
