

When the day of Pentecost had come, [the disciples] were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

- The Acts of the Apostles 2:1-4

Tune 8th is Pentecost Sunday, the day mentioned above when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples of Jesus, empowering them to go out and declare the love of God in the crucified and risen Christ. This story of the very dramatic outpouring of the Spirit on that day is read each year on the Day of Pentecost. It includes many names of many places that are difficult to pronounce, and which may make us feel as if we are speaking in tongues. We do not ordinarily experience such a visible and dramatic outpouring of the Spirit, and we may feel either that this kind of thing doesn't really happen, at least not anymore, or we may feel as though we have not really experienced the Spirit, because we haven't had a super-natural manifestation of the Spirit in signs and power.

Neither assessment is correct. God can, and sometimes does, act in powerful and mysterious ways, AND God acts in the common, mundane episodes of life. God's Holy Spirit does move us, sometimes in ways that are unmistakable, and sometimes in the sighs and moans that are too deep for words to convey, but which reflect the cry from our heart.

This year on Pentecost Sunday we will be celebrating with seven of our youth – Gavin Aloi, Joe Cirillo, Isaac Godfrey, Anna Kinder, Luke McCallum, Evan Plachuta, Gregory Smith – as they affirm their faith in the rite of Confirmation. On this day we celebrate the movement of the same Holy Spirit that empowered Peter and the original disciples. We pray, "stir up in <u>name</u> the gift of your Holy Spirit." We ask that the Spirit of God strengthen and empower these young people so that they may continue in the faith, assured that the love of Jesus goes

with them everywhere, and that, because of the presence of the Holy Spirit, they know they are never alone.

We are not likely to have the rush of a violent wind. We are not likely to see tongues as of fire descending on them (in fact, if we do, many will be more alarmed than inspired!). But we will call on the Holy Spirit to be present with blessing, and when we call, God shows up.

As we ask God's blessing on the youth, and to stir up in them the Holy Spirit, we are also reminded that the same words were said to us at our baptism and at our confirmation. We can recall how God has been with us in times of struggle, and that God calls us to go into the world to share the love of Jesus with all people, through what we say and what we do. We are called to act in love toward those whom we know, and those we will never know but who still stand in need of care and support. We are reminded that the Spirit does not just comfort us; the Spirit also empowers us and sends us out. That is the charge that was given to us in baptism when we were joined to Jesus, and the family of God that is the Church:

"We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world."

Are you ready to be filled with the Holy Spirit? Are you ready to speak of the love of God in Christ? Are you ready to bear God's creative and redeeming word to all the world?

Ready or not, the Holy Spirit comes, and you will be filled!

Summary: Our total giving and income amounted to \$49,033. Our expenses were \$43,679. This resulted in a balance of \$5,354 for the month. This was a good month in giving and income which allowed us to get out of the negative for the year. Last month we were at a negative balance of almost \$4,000 for the year. We are now at a positive balance of a little over \$1,600.

Envelope/General Giving: We had a good month with almost \$40,000 received in our worship givings. Thank you for your

generous giving for the month of March. Year to date for worship givings are just over \$121,000.

Giving Opportunities: Your generous contributions are important to our church and play a crucial role in supporting our community initiatives.
