#### From Our Pastor

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

he third article of the Apostles' Creed lists the ways in which the Holy Spirit is active in the world: through the Church, in the community of the baptized, in the forgiveness of sin and the promise of resurrection to eternal life. As we come to All Saints Sunday, I continue to hear "the communion of saints" running through my head.

We celebrate the promise of God in our baptism as we remember those who have died in the Lord and been reunited with those who have gone before us. The promise given by the Holy Spirit when we were named and claimed in Baptism is the word that can sustain us as we continue our walk of faith. There is a way in which we are still connected in the communion of saints.

There is also the truth that it is because of the communion of saints on earth that we ourselves have come into relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Our parents brought us to the font. Our friends encouraged us to join and be active in a congregation. In day-to-day living and worshipping together, we receive strength in trials, and share our joys in living. These people have been for us, and we have been for others, the communion of saints.

As we gather on this All Saints Sunday, it is a wonderful time for our youth to affirm the faith of the church, the faith in which we baptize. Our youth have the chance to declare their confidence in the God who has claimed them as His own. They affirm their place in the communion of saints.

The thing about this communion which is so powerful is the communal nature of it. We are not good on our own. We are stronger, better, when we are in community. It is the communion of saints that brought us into relationship with Jesus. It is the communion of saints that sustains us when our loved ones go to be with Jesus. It is the communion of saints that reminds us that we are in God's community. We are not on our own. The Lord Jesus

is with us, leading, guiding, comforting and sustaining us. Jesus does this by the Holy Spirit moving in and among us in community.

Do not forget the power that is present in this holy community, the communion of saints. Do not block the movement of the Spirit. Do not forget that we are better in community. Let us continue to live together in the power of Jesus' spirit as we are the communion of saints!

have seen a trend develop. Earlier in the year we explained that the Restoring, Rebuilding, Renewing restoration appeal had come to an end. We did very well with a generous response from our members. We received more than \$400,000 in three years, \$380,000 from member giving. We mentioned that with the Appeal coming to an end, we needed people who had split their giving between the Building Fund and the General Fund to decrease offerings to the Building, and shift them back to General giving.

The trend we have seen shows people have half heard our plea. Giving to the Building Fund has decreased. However, it has not been shifted to the General Fund. The result is we are far behind in our income vs. expenses for the year.

The expenses are slightly higher than we had anticipated, due in particular to a harsh winter and a lot of snow removal last year, as well as some repairs we needed to make to our facilities. But all in all, spending is in line with what we budgeted. It is the income which is lacking.

We have shown that we have the resources to fund our ministry. We have given \$125,000 each year to the Restoration Project, so it is clear that we can cover the \$43,000 gap we are seeing so far this year. It does take, however, an intentional shift to support the work we do within the building we have restored.

We are counting on each of our members to do what they can to increase their support for the General Fund. Though it is never a straight line equation, if each of our 200 or so giving families were to give an extra \$200 between now and the end of the year, we would go far toward eliminating our deficit.

Please consider what you can do to fund our ministry. Thank you for your support.

Somehow she got donations/grants to rent a large trailer, equip it with shower facilities, soap, towels, and clean clothes. After the refreshing experience of cleaning up, this kind woman ended the experience with bags of snacks and water.

This story reminded me of a Bible verse from Matthew 25:53 - Jesus says, "I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink." Jesus will always be happy when we do good things for others, because we are doing good things for Him too.
