

hings never stop in the Kingdom of God. That is also true for the work we do in this corner of the Kingdom we know as Saint Matthew. Our schedule changes, but the mission we have to Connect people with God and each other, Care for the world in Jesus' name, eQuip our youth and their families for a life of faith in Jesus, and Cultivate a spiritual sense of generosity continue throughout the summer months.

Connect: Of course we continue to worship every week. We worship Jesus because he is worthy of our love, devotion, and gratitude. While we strive to have worship meaningful for the people who come, it can be important to remember that the primary reason we come to worship is not for what we can get out of it, but what we can give to the One who has given his life for us.

As you may have heard or read already, we lost a second tent in a severe weather event, and we have decided, after losing two tents in four years, not to replace it with a third tent. Worship, therefore, will be in the sanctuary at both 8:00 and 9:30 a.m.

We also have occasional times for fellowship between the services. These will be held on the second Sunday in July and August–July 13<sup>th</sup> and August 10<sup>th</sup>.

Care: We continue to care for those in need with our First Sunday Food Drives. On July 6<sup>th</sup> and August 3<sup>rd</sup> we will receive your non-perishable food items to share through the work of the Media Food Pantry. And we are collecting school supplies to share with children who do not have them through our partnership with Faith Immanuel Lutheran Church in East Lansdowne. Our Women of the ELCA circle is also continuing to receive gifts for the Welcome Church, Beds for Kids, Fair Acres, and Chester County Migrant Ministry.

**eQuip:** While regular, weekly Sunday School and Bible Study take a break for the summer, we still have Vacation Bible School in the midpoint of the season. This year VBS will be held July 28<sup>th</sup> through August 1<sup>st</sup>, with the theme "True North." We have dozens of children attend Vacation Bible School each year, most of whom are not members of Saint Matthew. While we may not see them every week, getting them for five days to hear the story of Jesus and his love for us is a wonderful way to

cultivate seeds of faith in these children. To do so in a fun and interactive setting can often bear more fruit than we can imagine. Be sure to encourage the children in your family and your neighborhood to attend!

Cultivate: Our congregation has always been generous in times of need. This is reflected in the many gifts given in kind for the many programs sponsored by our Social Ministry and Women of the ELCA teams, and by the generous cash gifts for Lutheran Disaster Response, Lutheran World Relief, and the ELCA World Hunger Appeal. It is also shown in the way that people "step up" when there is a particular concern with our facilities we need to address. One opportunity to stretch our spiritual generosity muscles is also in supporting our regular budget.

It is never quite as compelling to support the ongoing expenses of the church as it is to alleviate the concerns of those affected by a hurricane, but it is no less important to keep our congregation fiscally strong so that we can have a base from which we do our ministry. To let you know where we stand going into the summer, as of May 31 we were \$24,272 behind in income versus expenses. And in June we have had some rather expensive repairs to our air conditioning system that will set us back still further. While people travel for the summer, this is a time when regular offerings tend to also decrease. If you are able, please consider giving an extra gift to your church home to ensure we can have a strong summer, with less of a gap come the fall.

As you can see, things never stop in the Kingdom of God, as there are always people who need to hear and experience the love of God through Jesus Christ.

Summary: Year to date, our financials reflect a total income of \$196,403 against expenses of \$210,444, leading to an overall negative balance of \$14,041. Comparing to Fiscal Year 2024, we are about the same as we were then.

Additional Cost to Budget: For property, we replaced the door on the side of the church, which was around \$3,400.

Envelope/General Giving: As we conclude this month, our church has experienced a giving/income of \$35,993, while our expenses totaled \$51,675, resulting in a deficit of \$15,682 for the month. While we are facing a shortfall, it's important to remember that these challenges can also be opportunities for growth and increased stewardship.

Giving Opportunities: Consistency in regular giving is essential for the support and growth of our church community. By pledging our gifts regularly, we create a stable foundation that allows us to plan for ministry programs and outreach initiatives. Each contribution, no matter the size, enables us to fulfill our mission. We encourage everyone to remain committed to consistent giving as we work together to advance our mission and support our community. Thank you for your continued generosity and support during these times.

**Roof Fund Pledges:** This is a friendly reminder to please continue sending in your pledges that were made for the Roof Fund. These funds are being used to replenish our endowment funds, allowing us to support our church's mission. 
